

JOIN ST. MARGARET'S TO COMMEMORATE THE 80th. ANNIVERSARY OF THE D DAY LANDINGS.



GUNS OF ST. MARGARET'S at CLIFFE.

14" Inch Cross Channel Guns installed in 1940, and named "Winne," and "Pooh," after Churchill and the character in "Winnie the Pooh." They were manned by the Royal Marines Siege Regiment. The guns remained operational until September, 1944.

Site of a super high velocity gun capable of firing a 256 lb shell a distance of 70 miles. It was nicknamed "Bruce," but was never used operationally. The Site of "Bruce," has been completely covered over.

Wanstone Battery "Clem," and "Jane." Construction began in September, 1941, at Wanstone Farm between St. Margaret's and Dover for two 15" inch guns. The gun emplacements are currently being excavated.

Not yet open to the public, this is a rare opportunity to join a free tour of these emplacements on Saturday 8th. June, and Sunday 9th. June, at 09:30 for a 10:00 sharp start. **P** Parking as indicated opposite Sherley's Farm. A huge "Thank you," to the National Trust.
