Anti-social behaviour and other incidents of note:

- **A Number of Nuisance Vehicle Reports**

Reports of a nuisance motorbikes were made within the St Margaret's and Kingsdown area. Ranging from off road motorbikes to mini motorbikes being ridden causing alarm, distress and annoyance to others. Police attended the calls and area searches were completed. Some details have been taken and words of advice were given. This is also all part of an ongoing Police Operation, which has been made to tackle off road nuisance motor bikes in the area.

Items of good work:

I have been patrolling the local area where I have had the opportunity to meet more and more local residents by the day, parish councilors and keep that police presence to a high standard.

I still look to continue with conducting high visibility patrols in and around the local area, specifically areas that are having issues reported. Another priority is for high visibility patrols across all the parishes, engaging with local residents to discuss issues and to educate people regarding COVID19. I have been in contact with the KKC community wardens for the area and look forward to joint working with them more. I aim for us to work together to help identify and support vulnerable people within our communities during these challenging times as well as tackle other local issues brought to our attention. I will also be looking to hold PCSO surgeries within the community when safe to do so.

COVID19 - Government Health Guidelines are still in place to protect our communities. Kent Police continue to monitor and patrol our local communities keeping residents safe.

- Names of or if unknown, a description of the offender, as full as possible, including clothing.
- Any vehicle markings, such as registration numbers and a full description of the vehicle, including make/ model/ vehicle type, colour, any distinctive markings or damage.
- If images (stills or CCTV) can be obtained at no risk to the informant, please email these to your local officer or CSU.dover@kent.police.uk
